

Memorandum of Understanding

The HLST Network has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with LinkBC, a network of 20 Universities and Colleges in British Columbia, Canada.

Working together, we look forward to harnessing the potential for enhancement of the learning opportunities and experiences available to our students which the 2010 Winter Olympic and Paralympic Games in Vancouver, and the 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games in London bring.

The MoU was signed at the inaugural meeting of the HLST Network's new Olympics Special Interest Group in Oxford. Clive Robertson, Director of the HLST Network, welcomed the opportunities which the MoU brought: to learn from colleagues who had already made great progress in sharing good practice, research findings and resources which capitalised on the 2010 Games and for working together to maximize the impact for students in both the UK and Canada.
